

Initiating the Global Capacity-Building Initiative for Transparency – Global Support Programme in Central Asia and the Caucasus

Background

In 2019 UNEP/ UNDP Global Support Programme (GSP) activated its work on technical support for the region of Central Asia and the Caucasus. The **Regional Network for Central Asia and the Caucasus on Transparency and MRV** was established in 2019 to maintain a dialogue on climate change reporting requirements under the UNFCCC and to proceed to the Enhanced Transparency Frameworks (ETF) by 2024.

In 2022, with the start of the new Capacity-Building Initiative for Transparency – Global Support Programme (CBIT-GSP), funded by GEF, implemented by UNEP and executed by UNEP-Copenhagen Climate Centre (UNEP-CCC), the **Regional Network for Central Asia and the Caucasus** is resuming its operation and intends to continue its cooperation and support on climate transparency, MRV and reporting.

A capacity needs assessment of transparency was undertaken in November-December 2022, to identify gaps and needs, and to prioritize next steps, which - implemented both at the national and regional level- will help strengthen the reporting capacities of the members of the network on GHG inventory, adaptation, climate finance and NDC tracking in the frameworks of their NCs, BURs and BTRs.

Objective

The main objective of the inception workshop is to **introduce** the *Capacity-Building Initiative for Transparency – Global Support Programme (CBIT-GSP)* to the members of the regional network of Central Asia and the Caucasus and **kick-off** the *project work plan with proposed activities for 2023*.

It is expected that the participants will discuss the **key findings of the capacity needs assessment of transparency**, which has been recently conducted by the CBIT-GSP team and jointly agree on **proposed project activities for 2023** to support them *building technical and individual capacities* on climate transparency and reporting in the region.

Target Audience and Language

The Inception Workshop will gather Coordinators of National Communications and Biennial Update Reports, senior experts from the national agencies dealing with climate policy who oversee the establishment of MRV and the national Enhanced Transparency Frameworks and experts dealing with data collection and greenhouse gas inventory, adaptation and impacts, climate finance and NDC tracking. On the other hand, the meeting also awaits representatives from international agencies who are dealing with climate change and transparency in the region, including UNFCCC, UNDP, FAO, GIZ, ICAT and CAREC.

The meeting will be held **in Russian** with a simultaneous translation in English/Russian.

Duration and Registration
