Objective

Support country teams in technical understanding the reporting process for NDC mitigation commitments and associated requirements.

- Provide national mitigation teams with useful information and experiences to facilitate their reporting, including:
 - Preparing them to use the common tabular format;
 - The use of modeling tools for determining scenarios and projections and how they can be used for tracking NDCs;
 - The use of select NDC tracking tools.
- Get a kick start in tracking NDCs through the use of real country data and their own NDC.
- Exchange experiences and lessons learned, corresponding to the application of tools and systems for mitigation assessment, tracking and reporting.
- Identify common challenges and opportunities for collaboration among country teams on mitigation assessment, tracking and reporting.
