

3 - Transparency

A library of practices, methodologies and guidance, including Paris Rulebook and CGE.

5 - Platform for

requesting support

A platform and forum for requesting assistance with country reports and transparency issues



2 - Transparency country information

Profiles with information on progress on NCs and BURs, selfassessed needs, and CBIT projects.

4 - Interactive userdriven forum

Information exchange and online tools for peer learning, coordination for regional MRV and transparency networks.

During Q2 2022, 5 consultations held with transparency experts, country & project focal points, and international agencies & initiatives


Objective:

- Agree on national transparency information relevant to feature in country pages






Platform Development Process

- Shared responsibility among all to keep it updated and useful for everyone


