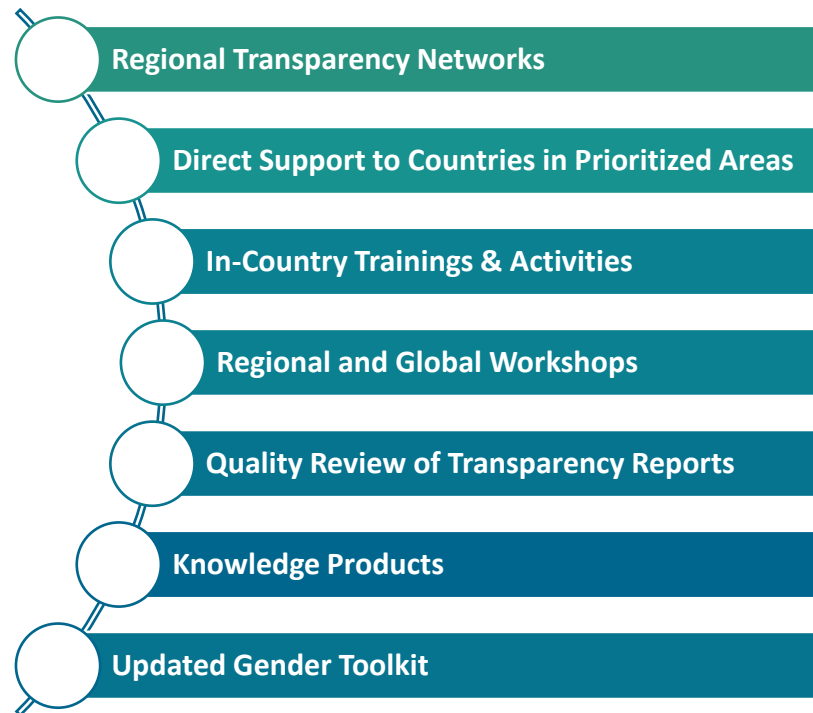

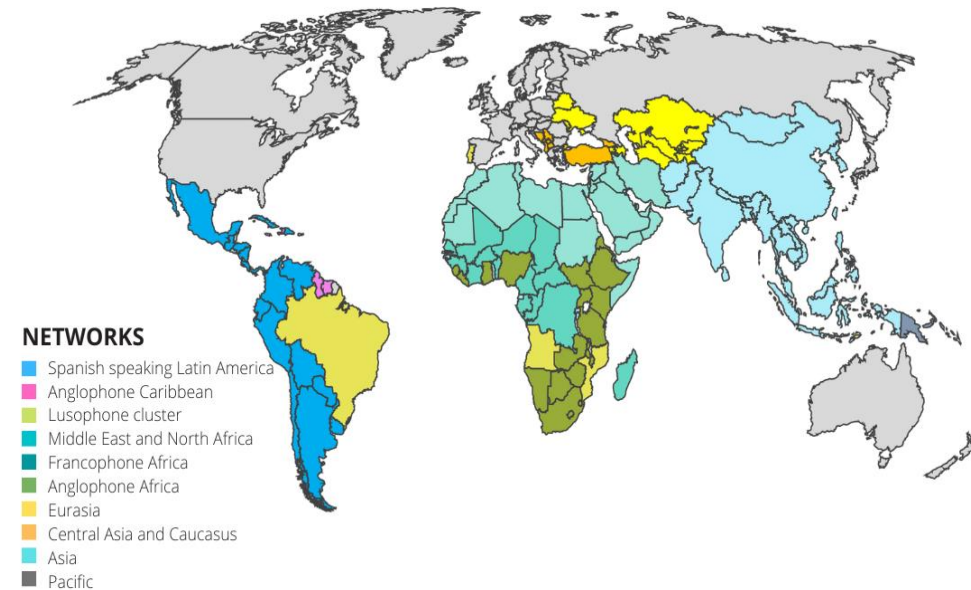

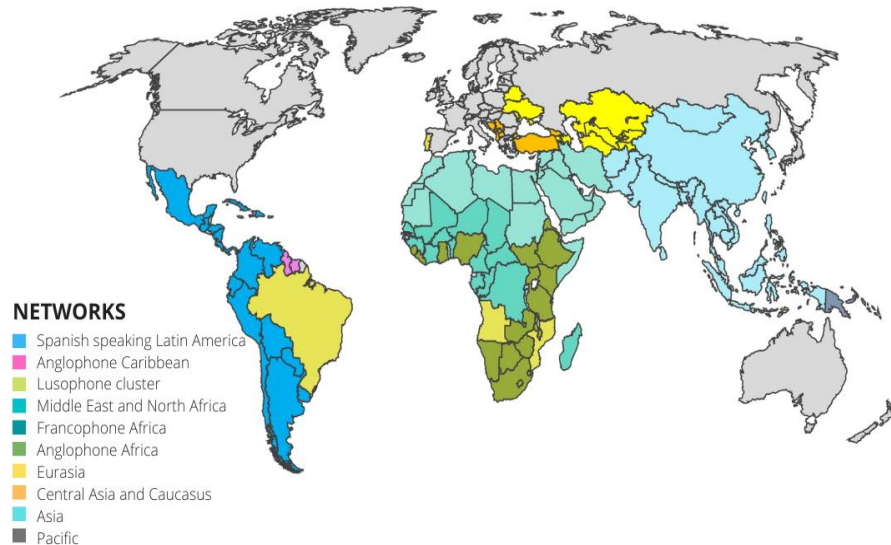

- Countries nominated Focal Points for the project and the different ETF areas (e.g., adaptation, GHG inventory)

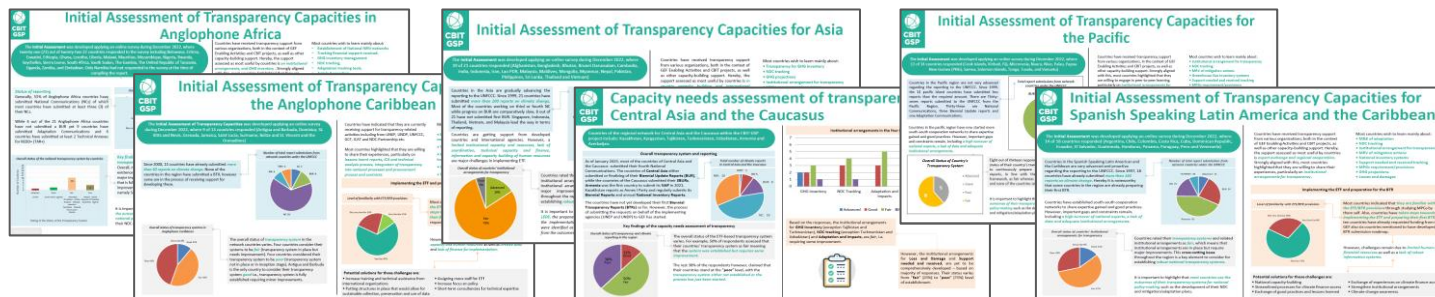
- Comprehensive survey with all countries to determine their needs and priorities

- Development of the workplan based on capacity needs assessment

- Launch of the Network with countries and collecting feedback on work plan

- Implementation of activities, both at regional and national activities, according to work plan and incoming support requests by countries

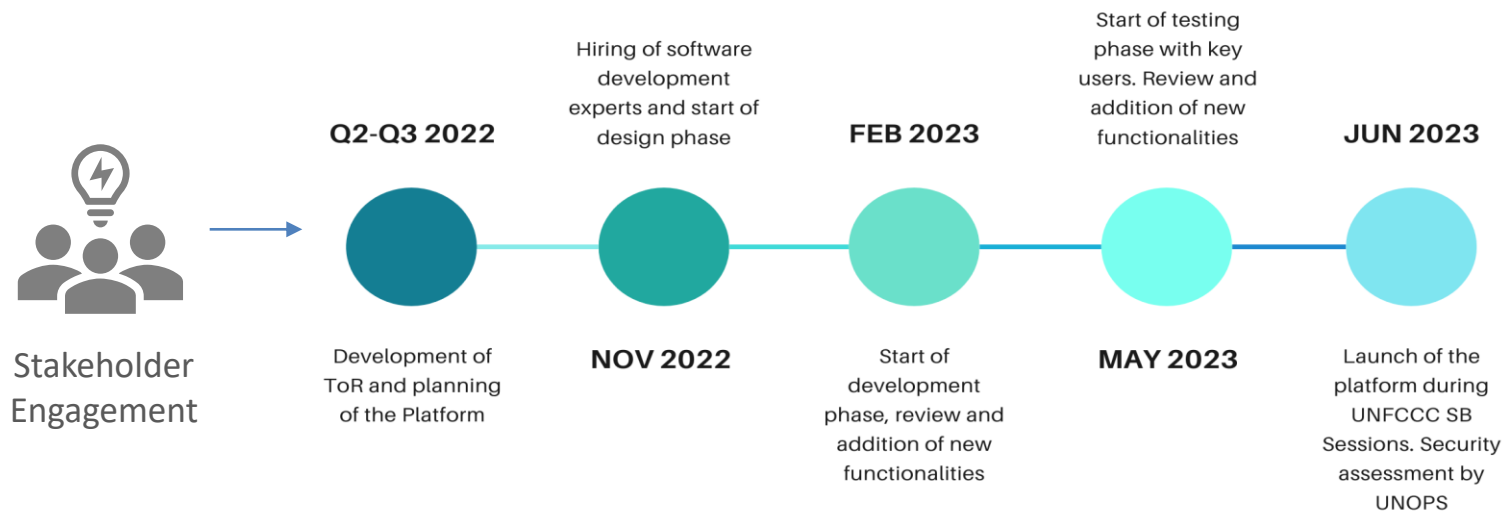

Further refinements of the Platform are ongoing to respond to the needs from the Climate Transparency Community

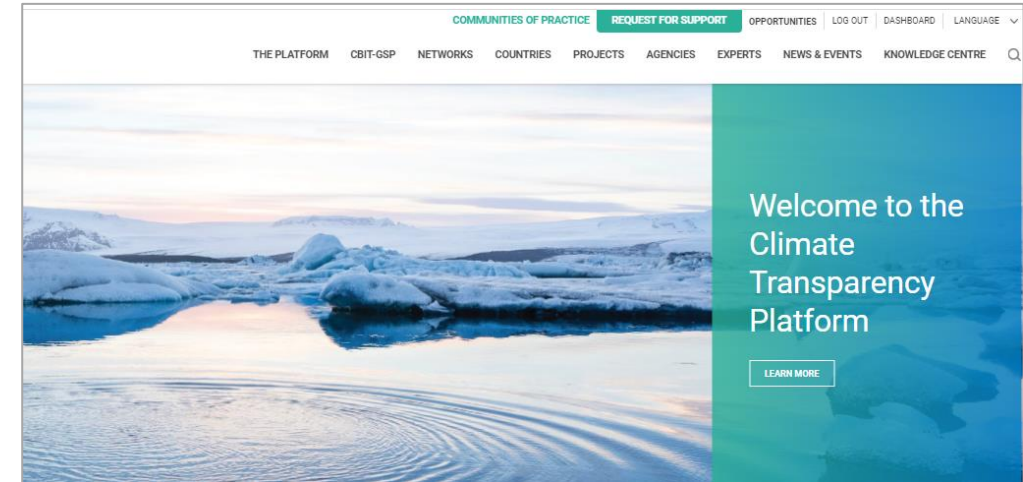

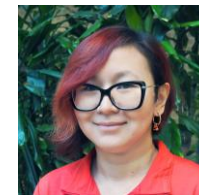
