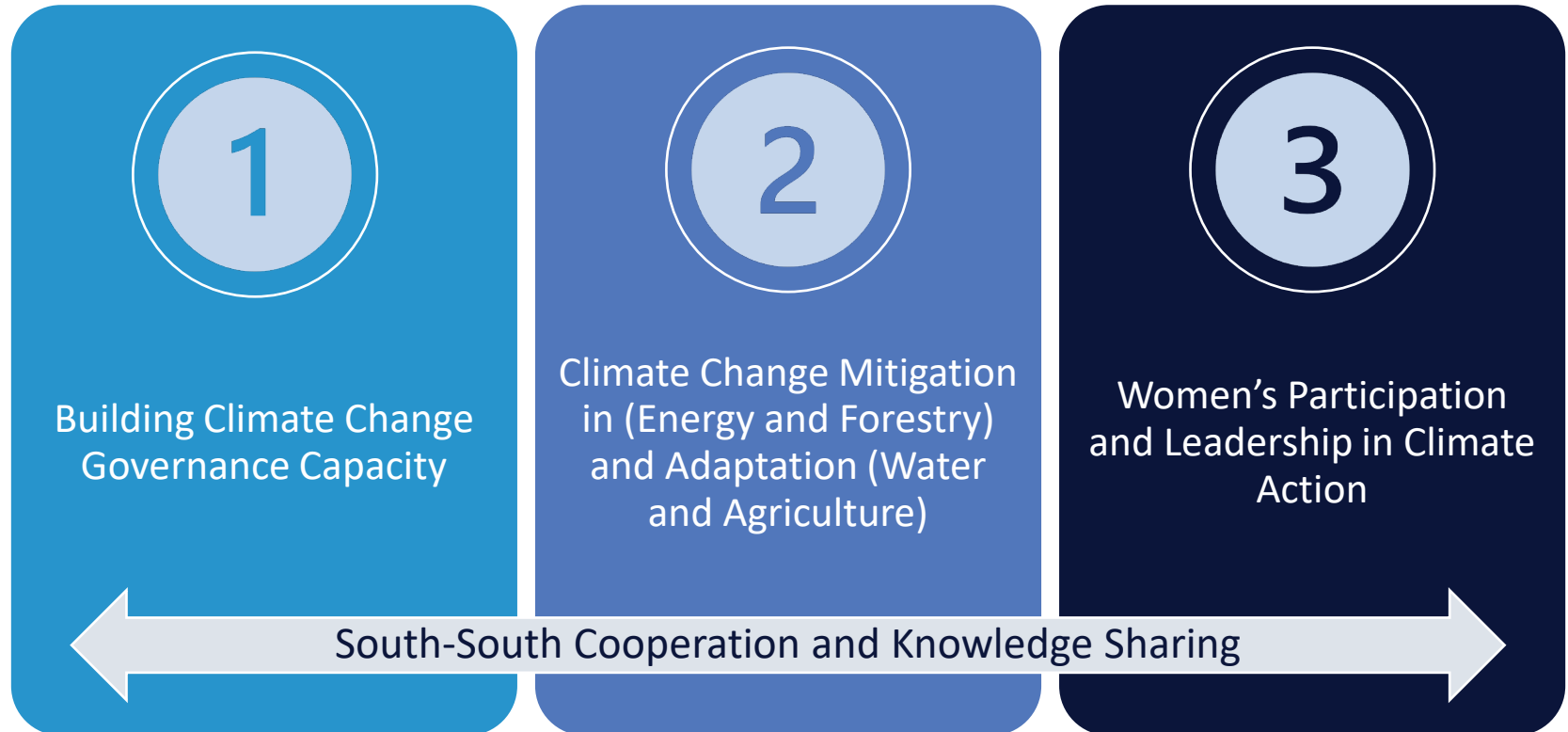


# Project Overview

- Based on locally identified needs

## Project Process & Flow – *Requesting Organizations (ROs)*



### 1. Request Development

Requesting Organization writes project objectives, outputs and outcomes considering: Support from Canadian Technical Experts



### 2. Submission

Requesting Organization submits its Request for Support

## Project Process & Flow cont. – *CAA Team*



### 3. Review and approval

Project Team applies criteria for approval in line with project pillars

The RFS is submitted to a selection committee for Approval



### 4. Participatory Elaboration and design

Project Team and Requesting Organization finalize project TORs



### 5. Recruitment & Selection of Technical Expertise

Project Team issues RFPs, shortlists/selects and contract successful bidder



## Project Process & Flow cont.



### 6. Engagement and planning

Technical Experts and Requesting Organization engage and plan implementation



### 7. Implementation

Technical Experts develop the work plan and schedule remote support and deployment for “on the ground mission”



### 8. Monitoring and reporting

Technical Experts monitor progress in line with the project PMF



### 9. Completion and learning
