








MALAWI'S CLIMATE CHANGE INSTITUTIONAL STRUCTURE

Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs)

- contains pledges on adaptation and mitigation actions to be implemented from 2015 to 2040, some with domestic support, others need external financial and technical support. These are aimed at reducing carbon emissions and building climate resilience to contribute towards sustainable development, food security and poverty eradication.
- Development of MRV under the CBIT project will help in tracking the implementation of NDC

National Adaptation Plan

- National Adaptation Plan (NAP) (work in progress)

 we are in the process to develop a NAP which will advance adaptation efforts in the medium and long-term periods.
- ► These are medium to long-term adaptation plans to ensure resilience to climate change.
- Progress developed a Road map and finalized the NAP Stock-taking report; received in March 2019 \$2.8 million from the Green Climate Fund (GCF) for NAP development.

- ▶ National Climate Change Investment Plan (NCCIP) (2014) has prioritized climate change actions on adaptation, mitigation, technology development and transfer, capacity building, research, and education that the country needs to advance. The NCCIP has provided an estimated budget for implement these actions.
- ▶ Guidelines for accessing the Green Climate Fund and Global Environment Facility-a tool meant to guide programme and project developers on the requirements for accessing funds for climate change management.

▶ All these instruments aim at promoting climate change adaptation and mitigation for sustainable livelihoods by developing measures that increase levels of knowledge and understanding in order to improve human well-being and social equity, while pursuing economic development that significantly reduces environmental risks and ecological scarcities.
