# Reporting provisions on support needed and received in NCs guidelines

## Decision 17/CP.8, Annex

49. Non-Annex I Parties should, in accordance with national circumstances and development priorities, describe any **constraints and gaps, and related financial, technical and capacity needs**, as well as proposed and/or implemented activities for overcoming the gaps and constraints, associated with the implementation of activities, measures and programmes envisaged under the Convention, and with the preparation and improvement of national communications on a continuous basis.
50. Non-Annex I Parties should provide information on **financial resources and technical support for the preparation of their NCs** provided by themselves, as well as those received from the Global Environment Facility (GEF), Annex II Parties or bilateral and multilateral institutions.
51. Non-Annex I Parties should also provide information on **financial resources and technical support provided for activities relating to climate change**, by themselves and by the GEF, Annex II Parties or bilateral and multilateral institutions.
52. Non-Annex I Parties are encouraged to provide, to the extent their capacities permit, **a list of projects proposed for financing**, in accordance with Article 12, paragraph 4, of the Convention, in preparation for arranging the provision of technical and financial support.
53. With regard to the development and transfer of technology, non-Annex I Parties are encouraged to **provide information on country-specific technology needs and assistance received** from developed country Parties and the financial mechanism of the Convention and, as appropriate, on how they have utilized this assistance in support of the development and enhancement of endogenous capacities, technologies and know-how.
54. Non-Annex I Parties are encouraged to **provide information on other relevant needs and/or areas for capacity-building** other than those mentioned in paragraphs 45,47,48 and 50.



# Reporting provisions on support needed and received in BUR guidelines

## Decision 2/CP.17, Annex III

The relevant paragraphs of decision 2/CP.17, that form the basis for reporting information on constraints and gaps, and related financial, technology and capacity-building needs and support received

*[Decision 2/CP.17. para 41]*

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41. Decides:

- (a) That non-Annex I Parties, consistent with their capabilities and the level of support provided for reporting, should submit their first BUR by December 2014; the LDC Parties and SIDS may submit BURs at their discretion;
- (b) That in using the Guidelines, non-Annex I Parties should take into account their development priorities, objectives, capacities and national circumstances;

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*[extract from annex III to decision 2/CP.17 relevant for FTC needs and support received]*

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14. Non-Annex I Parties should provide updated information on **constraints and gaps**, and related financial, technical and capacity-building needs.

15. Non-Annex I Parties should also provide updated information on **financial resources, technology transfer, capacity-building and technical support received for activities relating to climate change** from the GEF, Parties included in Annex II to the Convention and other developed country Parties, the GCF and multilateral institutions, including for the preparation of the current BUR.

16. With regard to the development and transfer of technology, non-Annex I Parties should provide information on **technology needs**, which must be nationally determined, and on **technology support received**.

## A. National circumstances, institutional arrangements and country-driven strategies

### OBJECTIVES:

- Sets into context the information provided in the BTR.
- Describe systems and tools to track and report.
- Implying link between support needed and country's climate priorities, such as in country's NDC.
- Challenges and limitations with respect to report on support needed and received.

130. Developing country Parties should provide information **on national circumstances and institutional arrangements** relevant to reporting on support needed and received, including:

- (a) A description of the systems and processes used to identify, track and report support needed and received, including a description of the challenges and limitations;
- (b) Information on country priorities and strategies and on any aspects of the Party's NDC under Article 4 of the Paris Agreement that need support.

## B. Underlying assumptions, definitions and methodologies

### Objectives:

- To make the information and data that is reported **understandable**, and it **explains the basis** on which the information is reported.
- To describe tools or methodologies used to collect the data; and explain how the country identified which sources or projects fell under their **definition/s of climate finance**.
- Promoting ETF guiding principles: **transparency, accuracy, completeness, consistency and comparability**.
- A key ETF MPG principle mentioned here is “**Ensuring that double counting is avoided**”, e.g. the way climate finance is defined, or assumptions made should not result in the double-counting

## B. Underlying assumptions, definitions and methodologies

131. In reporting information on support needed and received, developing country Parties should describe the underlying assumptions, definitions and methodologies used to provide information on support needed and received, including, **as applicable**, those used to:

- (a) Convert domestic **currency** into USD;
- (b) Estimate the amount of support **needed**;
- (c) Determine the reporting year or **time frame**;
- (d) Identify support as coming from specific **sources**;
- (e) Determine support as **committed, received or needed**;
- (f) Identify and report the **status** of the supported activity (planned, ongoing or completed);
- (g) Identify and report the **channel** (bilateral, regional or multilateral);
- (h) Identify and report the **type of support** (mitigation, adaptation or cross-cutting);
- (i) Identify and report the financial **instrument** (grant, concessional loan, non-concessional loan, equity, guarantee or other);
- (j) Identify and report **sectors** and subsectors;
- (k) Report on the **use, impact and estimated results** of the support needed and received;
- (l) Identify and report support as contributing to **technology** development and transfer and **capacity-building**;
- (m) **Avoid double counting** in reporting information on support needed and received for the implementation of Article 13 of the Paris Agreement and transparency-related activities, including for transparency-related capacity-building, when reporting such information separately from other information on support needed and received.

## Key aspects to pay attention to when reporting in the CTFs

- The expected frequency of reporting, especially reporting on needs timeframe
- The notation keys that can be used:
  - NA: not applicable
  - UA: unavailable
  - NR: not reported (to indicate voluntary character of the information)
- The need to link the table to the section of the BTR describing the underlying assumptions, definitions and methodologies used
  - The possibility to provide additional information including on support to activities related to averting, minimizing and addressing loss and damage associated with climate change impacts, and information e.g. links to project documents
  - Sector orientation of needs;
  - Sector and status consistent entry options (Completed, ongoing, planned)

# Key challenges and limitations when reporting on support received and needed

- Lack of data on financial support received, including the financial tracking systems and the capacity to estimate the support needed.
- Institutional arrangements insuring the stakeholder coordination, engagement and ownership.
- Reporting on use, impact and expected results of climate finance for adaptation.
- Integrating gender considerations into reporting.




## Challenge II. Institutional coordination and stakeholder engagement

- SCF Needs Determination Report identified **institutional coordination** as a major challenge
- Needs identification between sectors as well as local to national governance levels
- **Two main challenges:**
  - Lack of dedicated teams within ministries or other relevant institutions
  - Involving other ministries in the needs identification process

## Institutional coordination and stakeholder engagement


### The Belize National Climate Change Committee (BNCCC)

- Established as a broad-based multi-stakeholder committee comprised of non-state, public and private sector representatives.

The BNCCC can play a critical role to develop networks to mobilize climate related capital and expertise from the donor community (multilateral and bilateral); international chambers of commerce, and others and over time to increase the flow of capital to low carbon climate resilient infrastructure by, for example, helping private sector investors further partner with Green Banks.

## Challenge III. Reporting on use, impact and expected results of climate finance under ETF

- Mechanisms for monitoring the impact of climate finance are relevant for the implementation of the ETF, as per reporting parameter in CTF

## Challenge III. Reporting on use, impact and expected results of climate finance under ETF

### Some potential practices on reporting on use, impacts and expected results

- I. **Antigua and Barbuda** provides detailed registry of mitigation actions under implementation linked to national policy goals, with description of wider impacts and the type of funding received or needed if the action is yet to be implemented;
- I. **Benin** provides information on the impacts of support of each project receiving climate finance;
- I. **Egypt** provides information on the measures achieved by each project receiving climate finance;
- I. **Lebanon** provides information on the expected outputs related the projects under implementation with climate finance received;
- I. **Tajikistan** provides information on the monitoring and evaluation procedures for each project receiving climate finance.

## Challenge IV. Integrating gender considerations into reporting

- SCF Needs Determination report: **Less than 10% of needs referred to gender** or specific communities
- While advances are being made, there is little information on **gender-responsive budgeting**, suggesting that work remains to be done in integrating gender considerations on the ground.

# Steps to enhance reporting on support needed and received

## Step 1: Stocktake

- Conduct a stock-taking exercise to determine readiness to implement the ETF provisions on support needed and received

## Step 2: Enhance existing institutional arrangements

- Identify actions and priorities to enhance the existing institutional arrangements

## Step 3: Identify and prioritize the capacity-building needs

- Identify and prioritize the capacity-building needs with respect to implementing the ETF provisions on support needed and received

## Step 4: Seek support opportunities from transparency-related support providers

- Create an action plan and develop projects, activities and programmes and seek support from transparency-related support providers to enhance reporting of support needed and received
