




CONSERVATION INTERNATIONAL'S CBIT PORTFOLIO TODAY

Regional Perspective - Implementing Transparency Initiatives

1. Importance of Regional Cooperation:

- **Trust & Shared Goals:** <u>Transparent data sharing builds trust</u> and aligns countries on climate action, resource management, and sustainable development. For example the CBIT COMESA project: Demonstrates how transparency frameworks deliver collective benefits, offering a model, an entry point for other countries in the region to join.
- Country circumstances and status in reporting should be considered while implementing regional projects.

2. Sustainability:

- Long-term Continuity: Record-keeping is key for preserving institutional knowledge, enabling seamless staff transitions.
- Employing Digital Repositories: Centralized databases ensure sustainability and continuity across teams.

3. Capacity Building & Knowledge Sharing:

- Training & Empowerment: Equips stakeholders with skills for effective data collection and reporting.
 Knowledge sharing is a good way to reach other partners i.e. the private sector.
- Collaborative Learning: Peer networks and exchange programs foster regional growth and support. i.e, through organizing joint events at major events like the COP.

4. Gender Mainstreaming:

- Inclusive Development: Gender balance strengthens perspectives and outcomes in CBIT activities.
- **Empowerment:** Equal participation in training and leadership roles enhances sustainability.
