Objectives and purpose of the training

This workshop aims to enhance the capacity of key stakeholders in the Sri Lanka to prepare a comprehensive and accurate BTR. It will cover the fundamental aspects of the ETF, with particular focus on GHG inventories, NDC tracking, and the use of common reporting tables and common tabular formats. By the end of the workshop, participants will have a solid understanding of the BTR requirements, proficiency in GHG inventory preparation, and the ability to track and report on NDC progress effectively.

The workshop has the following specific objectives:

- Familiarize participants with the Biennial Transparency Report requirements under the Paris Agreement and its Enhanced Transparency Framework (ETF)
- Improve the proficiency of participants in preparing and managing national Greenhouse Gas (GHG) inventories, developing a comprehensive national inventory document, and effectively employing the common reporting table for reporting emissions.
- Exchange experiences and lessons learned, corresponding to the application of IPCC and UNFCCC tools and systems for reporting inventory data with ETF provisions.
- Comprehend the Sri Lanka' Nationally Determined Contribution (NDC) commitments
- Understand the linkage between NDC tracking and GHG inventory reporting
- Learn strategies for effective data management and collection for BTR preparation
- Gain knowledge on Quality Assurance/Quality Control procedures in BTR preparation
- Develop capacity to draft key sections of the BTR, including Common Reporting Tables (CRTs) and Common Tabular Format (CTF)

Expected Outcomes

The knowledge and skills gained from this workshop will be instrumental
in positioning the Sri Lanka to meet its climate reporting obligations
under the Paris Agreement, showcase its climate actions on the global









stage, and contribute to the collective goal of limiting global temperature rise and building resilience to climate change impacts.

Sri Lanka has submitted three National Communications (NCs) to the UNFCCC. The country is now making rapid progress towards implementing the ETF and developing its first Biennial Transparency Report (BTR).

The current context in the Sri Lanka regarding their climate transparency and reporting efforts highlights a critical phase as they prepare to submit their first Biennial Transparency Report (BTR) under the Paris Agreement's Enhanced Transparency Framework (ETF). This framework requires an in-depth account of greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions, tracking of mitigation actions, and progress toward the Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs) goals.

Given these demanding requirements, the Sri Lanka has requested support to strengthen their capacity in several key areas:

- Comprehensive GHG Inventory Preparation: The ETF mandates adherence to the 2006 IPCC guidelines and the use of specific reporting tables for GHG inventories. Ensuring accuracy, consistency, and transparency requires expertise in data collection, QA/QC procedures, and understanding inventory methodologies.
- Effective NDC Tracking: Tracking NDC progress under the ETF involves transparent reporting of both quantitative and qualitative achievements toward climate goals. This requires linking GHG inventory data with NDC sectors and addressing inconsistencies or data gaps.
- Enhanced Capacity for Reporting: Preparing a BTR is a new process, which involves technical knowledge of reporting tools and formats, such as the Common Tabular Format (CTF), and skills in scenario-building for emissions projections.

To address these needs, a two-day workshop has been organized to equip key Sri Lankan stakeholders with the essential knowledge and skills for BTR preparation. This support will facilitate compliance with ETF requirements and help showcase the Sri Lanka' climate actions on the global stage.
