Use, impact and estimated results

- The virtual workshop on Enhanced Transparency Framework (ETF) and Biennial Transparency Report (BTR) preparation represents a significant capacity-building initiative for Bangladesh. The workshop is designed to prepare the country's technical team for their first BTR under the Paris Agreement through specialized training delivered via Microsoft Teams, with daily four-hour sessions focused on three critical areas: GHG inventory management and reporting, NDC tracking and progress reporting, and financial and technology support reporting requirements.
- The workshop is expected to have substantial impacts on institutional capacity development and technical capabilities. It will strengthen Bangladesh's expertise in climate action reporting while building sustained institutional knowledge for ongoing BTR preparation. The training will create a valuable network of trained stakeholders across relevant ministries and departments, enhancing their collective ability to manage and report climate actions. On the technical side, participants will develop proficiency in using essential tools like IPCC inventory software and MITICA, while gaining a deeper understanding of common reporting tables and formats.
- The training is anticipated to significantly improve the quality of Bangladesh's climate reporting. By ensuring compliance with the Enhanced Transparency Framework requirements, it will strengthen the completeness and consistency of the country's climate action reporting. This enhanced capability will be particularly valuable for tracking and communicating progress on Nationally Determined Contributions, which are central to the Paris Agreement's goals.
- Upon completion of the workshop, participants are expected to achieve several concrete outcomes. They will gain the ability to independently complete CTF tables for NDC tracking and progress reporting, operate IPCC inventory software, conduct uncertainty assessments, and use MITICA for GHG emission projections. Additionally, they will develop expertise in applying modalities, procedures, and guidelines across all reporting areas, with a particular focus on managing national GHG inventories and implementing TACCC principles (transparency, accuracy, completeness, consistency, and comparability).
- This capacity-building initiative represents a crucial step in Bangladesh's transition to the Enhanced Transparency Framework. By developing a









core team of trained professionals who can effectively prepare and manage climate action reporting, the workshop will help ensure Bangladesh can meet its international reporting obligations and effectively communicate its climate actions and progress to the global community. The knowledge and skills gained through this workshop will contribute not only to the preparation of Bangladesh's first BTR but also to the country's long-term capacity to maintain high-quality climate action reporting.

Additional information (Current context and reason for requesting the support)

Bangladesh is at a crucial juncture in implementing the Enhanced Transparency Framework (ETF) under the Paris Agreement. The country is transitioning from existing measurement, reporting, and verification (MRV) arrangements to a more comprehensive and detailed reporting system through its first Biennial Transparency Report (BTR). This transition presents both an opportunity to showcase national climate efforts and a significant technical challenge that requires targeted support.

The preparation of Bangladesh's first BTR requires enhanced technical capacity in several complex areas, particularly in GHG inventory management and NDC tracking. The document indicates that the country needs to adopt new methodologies and tools, including the 2006 IPCC guidelines and common reporting tables (CRT), which represent a significant advancement from previous reporting requirements. The technical complexity of these new requirements, combined with the need for comprehensive data collection and management systems that adhere to TACCC principles (transparency, accuracy, completeness, consistency, and comparability), creates a clear need for capacity building support.

The support through this virtual workshop is particularly timely and relevant as Bangladesh works to strengthen its institutional framework for climate reporting. The document suggests that the country needs to build a robust system for tracking NDCs, managing GHG inventories, and reporting on financial and technological support. This specialized training will help bridge existing knowledge gaps and establish the technical expertise required for sustained, high-quality climate action reporting under the new transparency framework. Beyond the immediate need for BTR preparation, this support will help Bangladesh develop long-term institutional capacity for climate reporting. The training will create a core team of technical experts who can not only contribute to the first BTR but also help maintain and improve the country's transparency reporting systems over time. This institutional strengthening is essential for Bangladesh to effectively participate in the global climate action framework and demonstrate progress toward its climate commitments.
