





Provide reliable information to the international community showing national achievements, build trust, and attract investments

Meet the international UNFCCC reporting requirements and allow for continuous improvements

### Why FTC?

...mechanisms for monitoring the impact of climate finance are relevant for the implementation of the ETF, and indicators used for measuring impact are used by climate funds

#### **Examples - Mitigation**

- GHG emissions reduced
- MW installed capacity
- Volume of fuel per km travelled

- Number of beneficiaries
- Hectares protected
- Number of projects that foster climate resilience

#### **Objectives of this sub-chapter:**

Challenges and limitations with respect to reporting on support needed and received

130. Developing country Parties should provide information **on national circumstances and institutional arrangements** relevant to reporting on support needed and received, including:

(a) A description of the systems and processes used to identify, track and report support needed and received, including a description of the challenges and limitations;

(b) Information on <u>country priorities and strategies and on any aspects of the Party's NDC</u> under Article 4 of the Paris Agreement <u>that need support</u>.

### B. Underlying assumptions, definitions and methodologies

131. Developing country Parties **should** describe the underlying assumptions, definitions and methodologies, including, **as applicable**, those used to:

- (a) Convert domestic currency into USD;
- (b) Estimate the amount of support **needed**;
- (c) Determine the reporting year or time frame;
- (d) Identify support as coming from specific **sources**;
- (e) Determine support as committed, received or needed;
- (f) Identify and report the status of the supported activity (planned, ongoing or completed);
- (g) Identify and report the **channel** (bilateral, regional or multilateral);
- (h) Identify and report the type of support (mitigation, adaptation or cross-cutting);
- (i) Identify and report the financial instrument (grant, concessional loan, non-concessional loan, equity, guarantee or other);
- (j) Identify and report **sectors** and subsectors;
- (k) Report on the use, impact and estimated results of the support needed and received;
- (I) Identify and report support as contributing to technology development and transfer and capacity-building;

(m) **Avoid double counting** in reporting information on support needed and received for the implementation of Article 13 of the Paris Agreement and transparency-related activities, including for transparency-related capacity-building, when reporting such information separately from other information on support needed and received.

### C. Information on financial support needed

#### **Textual format:**

[to the extent possible and as available and as applicable]

- a) Sectors for which the Party wishes to attract international finance, including existing barriers to attracting international finance;
- b) Description of how the support will contribute to its NDC and to the longterm goals of the Paris Agreement.



### Key items to pay attention to when filling in the CTFs

□ The expected <u>frequency</u> of reporting, especially reporting on needs time frame

- □ The **notation keys** that can be used:
  - NA: not applicable
  - UA: unavailable
  - NR: not reported (to indicate voluntary character of the information)
- The need to <u>link the table to the section</u> of the BTR describing the underlying assumptions, definitions and methodologies used
- The possibility to provide <u>additional information</u> including on support to activities related to averting, minimizing and addressing loss and damage associated with climate change impacts
- □ <u>Sector</u> orientation of needs
- □ Sector, status, type of support, financial instruments, etc. have standardized options for reporting

### Reporting on "(expected) time frames"

...support needed and received, to the extent possible, as available and as applicable

...keep in mind the **two-year cycle** of the BTR

#### Guidance on reporting "expected time frame" of the financial support needed (Table III.6)

Parties include information on support needed <u>from the reporting year of the BTR</u>

- Table III.6 "Expected time frame"
- e.g. reporting year 2024 = 2024 onwards

#### Guidance on reporting "time frame" of the financial support received (Table III.7)

Parties include information on support received, <u>ongoing or planned since the previous BTR</u>

- "applicable starting from the second round of BTRs"
- Table III.7 two relevant parameters "Time frame" and "Status of activity"
- e.g. reporting year 2026 = support received between 2024-2026
