


### Transparency in the context of the MPGs



Article 13 decision 18/CMA.1, Paris Agreement adopts the enhanced transparency framework (ETF) for action and support

The ETF is a common framework applicable to all Parties, with specific flexibility provisions provided to DC Parties that need it in the light of their capacities in its implementation.




### Why map national climate finance flows



For your own national planning.

A prerequisite to identify support needs, and make targeted support requests. Provides an overview of government spending and other national investments.









### Why map support needed



For your own national planning and climate finance strategy, as it is the result of an assessment of available national resources and needed support to ensure implementation

To identify existing barriers for investments and potentially unlock private and international financial flows towards low carbon development

To attract financial support, lowering the cost of financing, potentially enhancing ambition and cover the incremental cost of climate action

Hard to communicate in detail without a proper overview of:

- Investments needed / costs
- National investments











### Why map support received



- Comply with the reporting requirements of the UNFCCC
- Follow up on and report support by source and identify potential underutilized vehicles
- Verify and evaluate the information about support provided by sources of climate finance
- Lessons from various experiences of the financial instruments used

- Improve confidence, transparency and accountability
- Improve understanding of how support is utilized
- Analyse whether the support is effective
- Facilitate the development of policies to enhance climate finance through the provision of more complete data









### A. National circumstances, IAs and country-driven strategies CBIT-GSP



#### **OBJECTIVES:**

- Sets into context the information provided in the BTR.
- Describe systems and tools to track and report.
- Implying link between support needed and country's climate priorities, such as in country's NDC.
- Challenges and limitations with respect to report on support needed and received.

- 130. Developing country Parties should provide information on national circumstances and institutional arrangements relevant to reporting on support needed and received, including:
- (a) A description of the <u>systems and processes</u> used to identify, track and report support needed and received, including a description of the <u>challenges and limitations</u>;
- (b) Information on <u>country priorities and strategies and on any aspects of the Party's NDC</u> under Article 4 of the Paris Agreement <u>that need support</u>.

### B. Underlying assumptions, definitions and methodologies CENT-GSP

To make the information and data that is reported understandable, and it explains the basis on which the information is reported.

To describe tools or methodologies used to collect the data; and explain how the country identified which sources or projects fell under their definition/s of climate finance.

Promoting ETF guiding principles: transparency, accuracy, completeness, consistency and comparability.

A key ETF MPG principle mentioned here is "Ensuring that double counting is avoided", e.g. the way climate finance is defined, or assumptions made should not result in the double-counting















### B. Underlying assumptions, definitions and methodologies



131. Developing country Parties should describe the underlying assumptions, definitions and methodologies used to provide information on support needed and received, including, as applicable, those used to:

- Convert domestic currency into USD;
- Estimate the amount of support needed;
- Determine the reporting year or time frame;
- Identify support as coming from specific **sources**;
- Determine support as **committed**, **received or needed**;
- Identify and report the **status** of the supported activity (planned, ongoing or completed);
- Identify and report the **channel** (bilateral, regional or multilateral);
- Identify and report the **type of support** (mitigation, adaptation or cross-cutting);
- Identify and report the financial **instrument** (grant, loan, loan, equity, guarantee)
- Identify and report sectors and subsectors;
  - (k) Report on the **use**, **impact and estimated results** of the support needed and received;
- (I) Identify and report support as contributing to **technology** development and transfer and capacity-building;
- (m) Avoid double counting in reporting information for the implementation of Article 13








### Blurred lines between support types



### Key aspects to pay attention to when reporting in the CTFs (CLIMATE TRANSPARENCY



**Reporting frequency:** Be clear, especially on timeframe for needs.

### **Notation keys:**

- NA = Not applicable
- UA = Unavailable
- NR = Not reported (voluntary info)
- NE = Not estimated

Link tables to BTR: Connect to assumptions, definitions, and methodologies.

Add extra info: e.g. support for loss & damage, links to project documents.

### Key challenges and limitations when reporting on Support NR CEIT-GSP



Lack of data on financial support received, including the financial tracking systems and the capacity to estimate the support needed.



Institutional arrangements insuring the stakeholder coordination, engagement and ownership.



Reporting on use, impact and expected results of climate finance for adaptation.



Integrating gender considerations into reporting.

### **NOT** mandatory

The provision of information on support needed and received is still not mandatory for developing countries. As such, it is not a requirement but countries should strive to report this information

- Recognition of effectiveness of support
- Cross referencing with support provided
- Identification of needs and attracting further support

### **ETF MPG**

The MPG for Article 13 provide much more details on the relevant information to be reported on support needed and received.

- Streamlining information between parties
- Guide the collection of relevant data

### Challenges

There are different national circumstances and capacities between countries, including arrangements to capture the information.

- Institutional arrangements
- Differences and uncertainty on definitions and methods
- Guidance and capacity to assess support needed and received
