








- Established in 1992
- Provided more than \$21.7 billion in grantsglobally and mobilized an additional \$119 billion in co-financing for more than 5,000 projects and programs
- Funds: both developed and developing countries are or have been donors to the GEF Trust Fund. Since its inception the GEF has received contributions from 40 donor countries



GEF is a financial mechanism to support implementation of UN global Conventions in developing countries:

- Convention on Biological Diversity (UNCBD)
- UN Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC)
- UN Convention to Combat Desertification (UNCCD)
- Stockholm Convention on Persistent Organic Pollutants (POPs)
- Minamata Convention on Mercury
- Montreal Protocol on Ozone Layer Depleting Substances
- Multilateral Agreements on International Waters and Transboundary Water Systems

#### **GEF Governance:**

- **GEF Assembly**: all 184 participant countries
- **GEF Council**: 32 members (14 from developed countries, 16 from developing countries and 2 from economies in transition) + 32 alternates; Council Members rotate every three years; Council meets twice annually
- **GEF Secretariat**: WB hosts the GEF Secretariat in Washington DC
- Trustee of the GEF Trust Fund: World Bank

#### **Project approval Cycle:**

- Project Identification Form (PIF)
- Project Preparation Grant (PPG)
- Project Proposal Document

#### **Eligibility Criteria:**

- Eligible country: ratified the convention(s) the GEF serves
- National priority: driven by the country and be consistent with national priorities
- GEF priorities: to achieve global environment benefits
- Financing: GEF financing only is for the agreed incremental costs; co-financing requirement ~1:7
- Preparation: broad stakeholder consultation

#### **Challenges and opportunities for Armenia:**

- Technical assistance
- Experience gained over long period
- UNDP-GEF unit
- Rather pilot projects
- Covering incremental costs
- Co-financing requirements: 1:7
- No direct access




GCF was fund established within the framework of the UNFCCC as an operating entity of the Financial Mechanism for Paris Agreement to assist developing countries in implementation of **adaptation** and **mitigation** commitments.

• Established: 2010

• First Project Approval: 2015

 Funds: Committed contribution from developed countries (voluntary from developing countries)

#### **Challenges and opportunities for Armenia:**

- Limited capacities to access funds for adaptation
- Big projects opportunity
- Direct access
- Co-financing requirements
- Implementation monitoring from GCF Secretariat
- Fast track accreditation with AF if accredited with GCF



**Adaptation Fund**: international fund that finances concrete adaptation projects and programs in developing countries helping eligible developing countries to adapt to the harmful effects of climate change.

Created under the Kyoto Protocol of United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) and continued under Paris Agreement

Launched: 2007

Operational: 2010

Direct Access by accredited national entities

#### **Funds:**

- 2% share of proceeds of the Certified Emission Reductions (CER) issued by Kyoto Protocol's Clean Development Mechanism (CDM)
- Donor contributions (donations)
- \$211.27 million was received through Clean Development Mechanism generated emissions reductions sales proceeds and \$964.44 million in donations, totaling cumulative receipts of \$1,175.70 million as of December 31, 2021
- Initially \$10 mln country cap; since 2021 \$20 mln country cap for national projects in each country by accredited implementing entities

- Board: 32 (16 members and 16 alternates) representing UN regional constituencies, Annex I countries, Non-Annex I countries, LDCs and SIDSs; rotation every two years; legal status in Germany
- Secretariat: Hosted by GEF Secretariat in Washington DC (WB)



#### **Challenges and opportunities for Armenia:**

- Total available: \$20 mln
- Accessed so far: \$4 mln
- Streamlined accreditation of EPIU (access to \$4 mln)
- Re-accreditation process of EPIU (potentially access to another \$4 mln)
- Demanding accreditation process
- Fast track accreditation with GCF if accredited with AF
- Possibility of second NIE accreditation
- Opportunity of a up to \$10 mln infrastructure project
- Pre-conditions to access the second \$10 mln (out of \$20)
