- Fostering cooperation between governments and educational entities that could narrow the knowledge, data, and skill gaps and enable [institutional and technical] capacity development and retention over time
- Enhancing awareness, education, and skill development for young students and professionals to take up an active role in the process

FAO-led youth-centered capacity-building initiative for enhanced transparency under the Paris Agreement





at the technical/
individual level

Disconnect between the climate science and university curriculum, skills work at the national and of educators, and educational priorities

at the organizational/ institutional level

Disconnect between government obligations and international level with the generation of knowledge and research priorities in addressing climate change

at the systemic level

Disconnect between skill development for youth and the national/international climate agendas and associated labor market, and lack of durability and capacity retention over time


