


Architecture of the Paris Agreement






Benefits of Transparency – Why is the BTR important?





Timeline: 2024 is not far away





What is "new" for any given country, depends on one's starting point today

- Frequency of reporting
- Reporting institutional arrangements
- GHG inventories
 - Use of the 2006 IPCC GL
 - Gases for reporting
 - Latest reporting year
 - Time series of reported data
- Projections
- Tracking Progress towards NDCs
- Reporting on finance, technology transfer and development and capacity building needed and received

Why become an Expert Reviewer?

- Learn new skills to advance your career
- Gain experience in your area
 of expertise
- Increase your network and meet new colleagues from around the world
- Learn what other countries do to fight climate change
- Bring lessons learned home to your country
- Travel to reviews activities
 throughout the world
- Help ensure transparent national reporting
- Over time, lead your own expert review team

How to become an Expert Reviewer?

Step 1. Register yourself on the Roster of Experts. This will alert your National Focal Point or the relevant intergovernmental organization to approve your self-nomination

Step 2. Complete relevant training programme, including passing the necessary exam(s)

Step 3. Participate on an expert team

What do we need this tool for?

- Ensure a smooth transition from reporting of BUR to BTR
- Guide the design and set-up of the transparency system underpinning the BTR process
- Get an orientation of the time required for the BTR implementation.



How does the tool work?

- 1) Six main steps
- 2) Guidance and recommendations to improve the quality of the process over time
- 3) Questions posed to check national circumstances and reporting capacity
- 4) Elaboration of a country-driven roadmap (time based on assumptions)




Main elements of the tool

Stocktaking: help countries to map out what the current in-country reporting arrangements are

ETF Requirements Mapping: guide countries to understand the new requirements and planning for the BTR implementation

Roadmap generation: provides a summary of the necessary steps leading up to the BTR with *indicative* required time period to complete the capacity development needed
